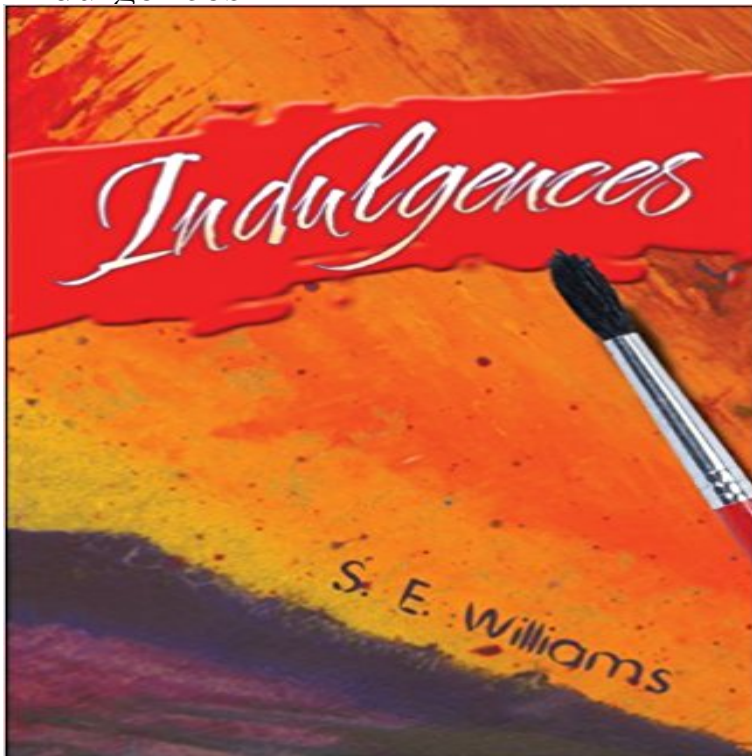


## Indulgences
