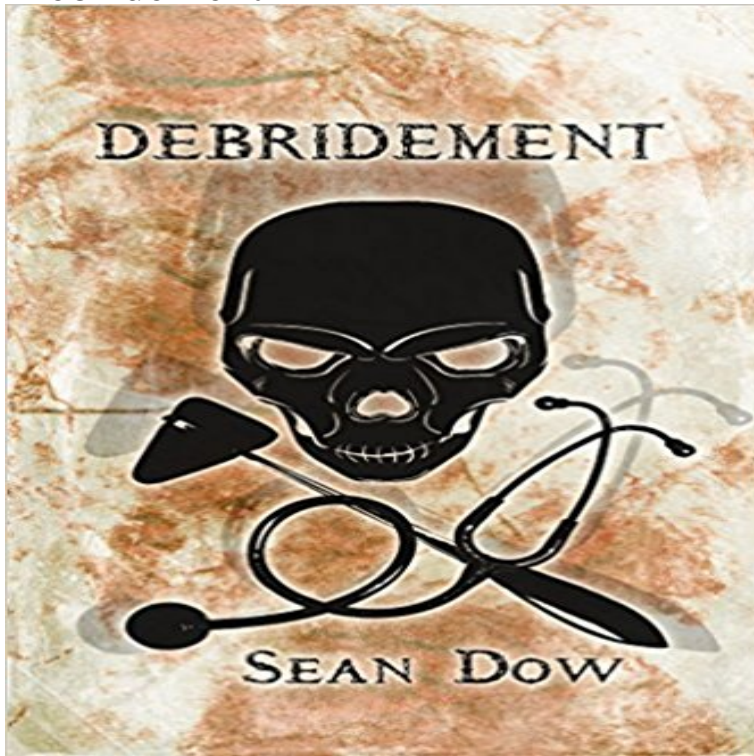


Debridement
