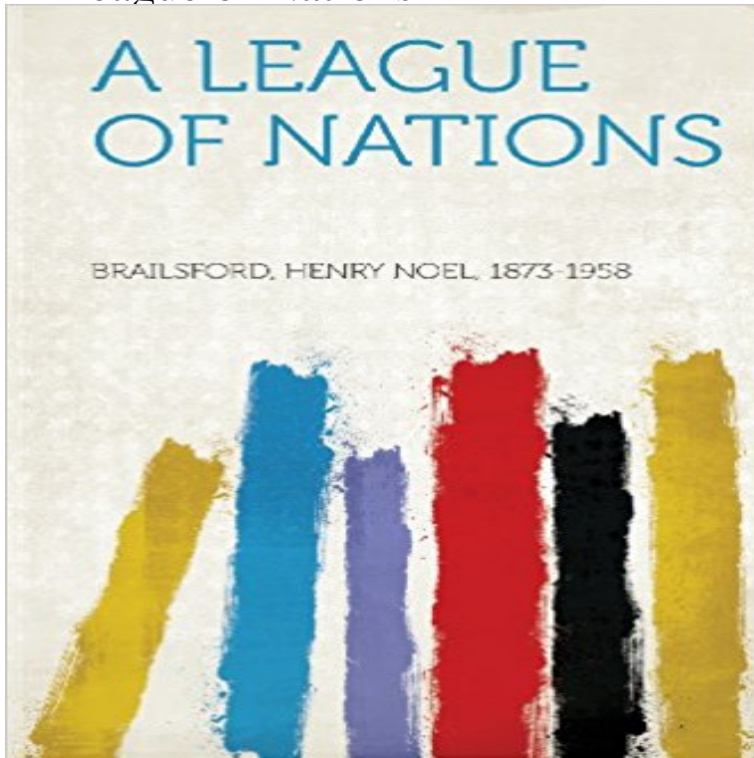


## A League of Nations
