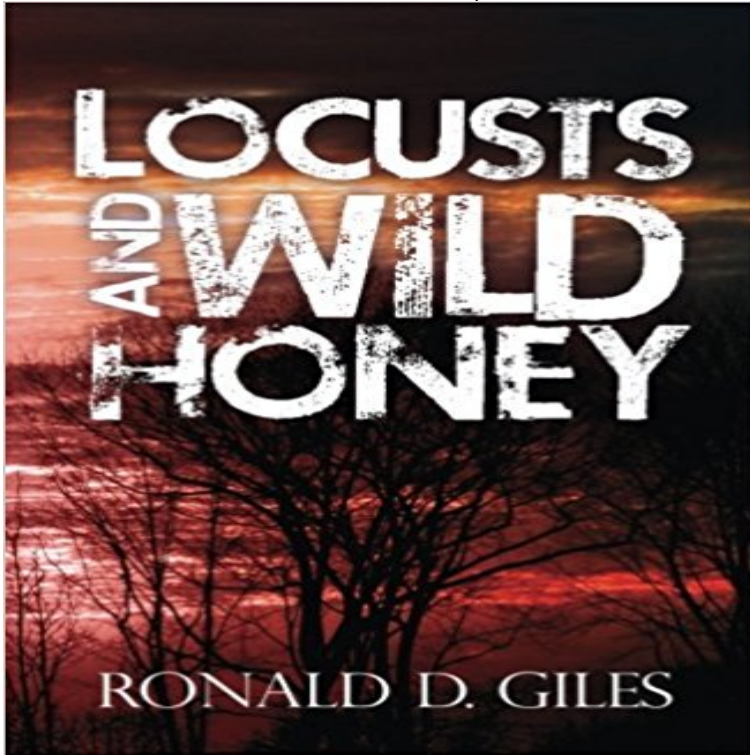


Locusts and Wild Honey
