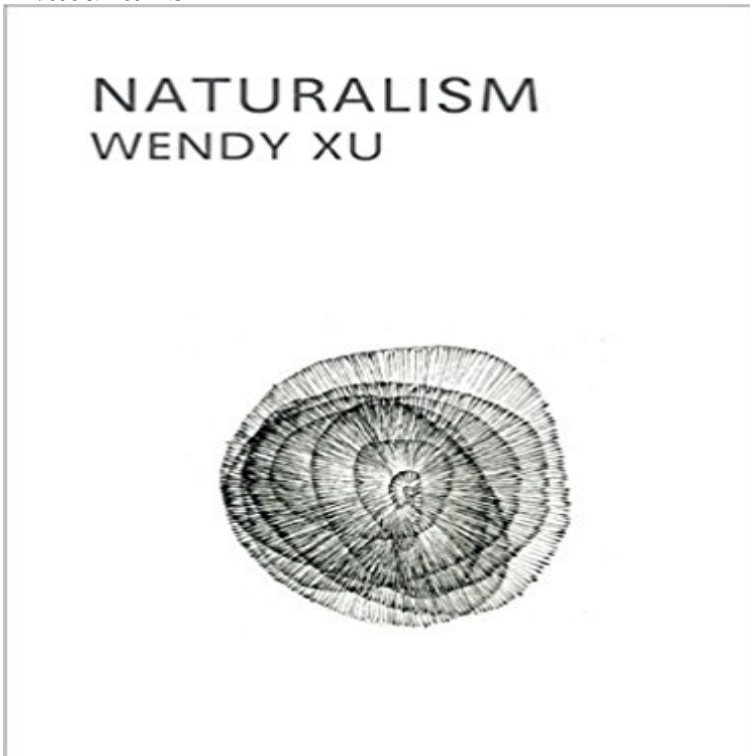


Naturalism
