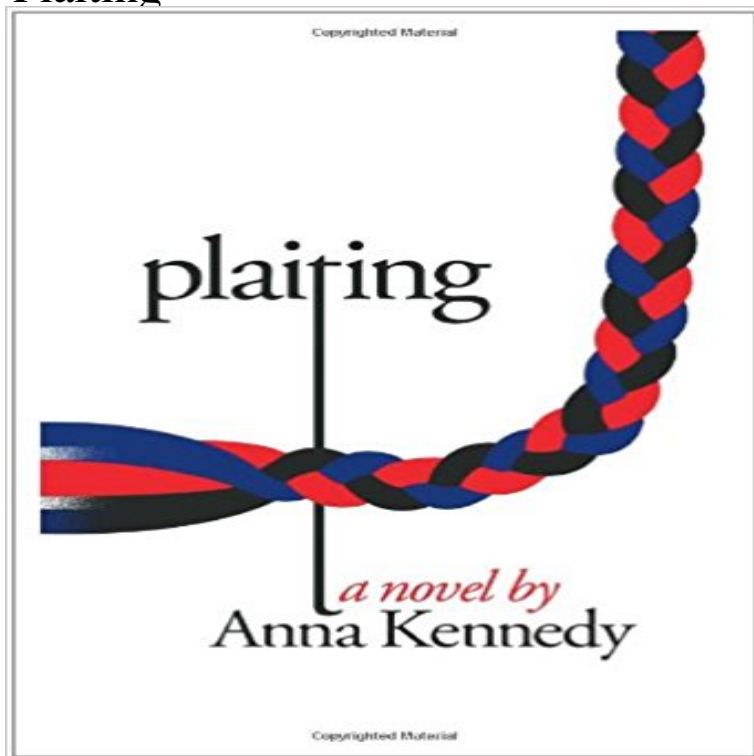


Plaiting

She responds by interfering, launching with childlike naivete into a campaign to put things right, with almost tragic consequences. Anna Kennedys funny and sad novel is about the life strands of faith, ambition, love and sex, which in Marys case are not yet fully plaited.
