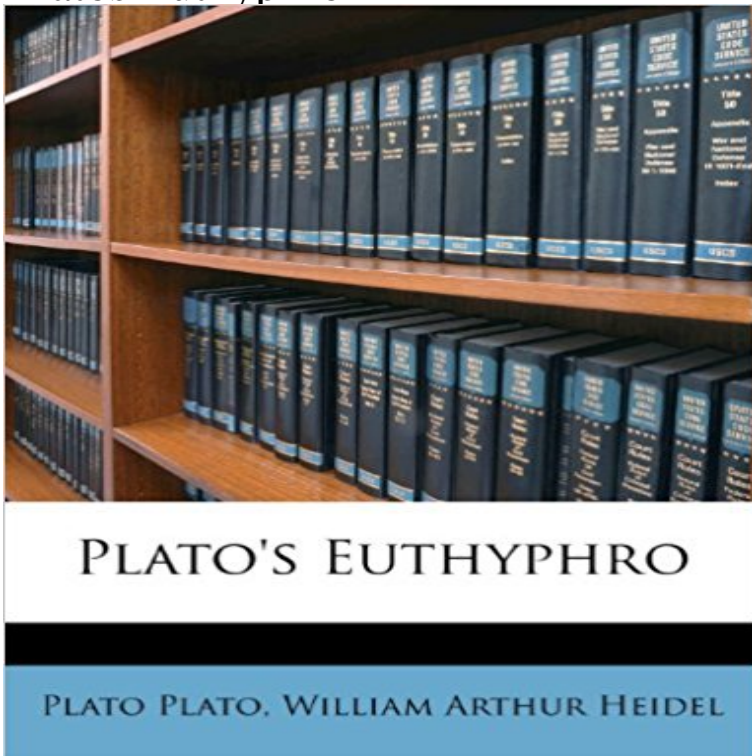


# Platos Euthyphro
