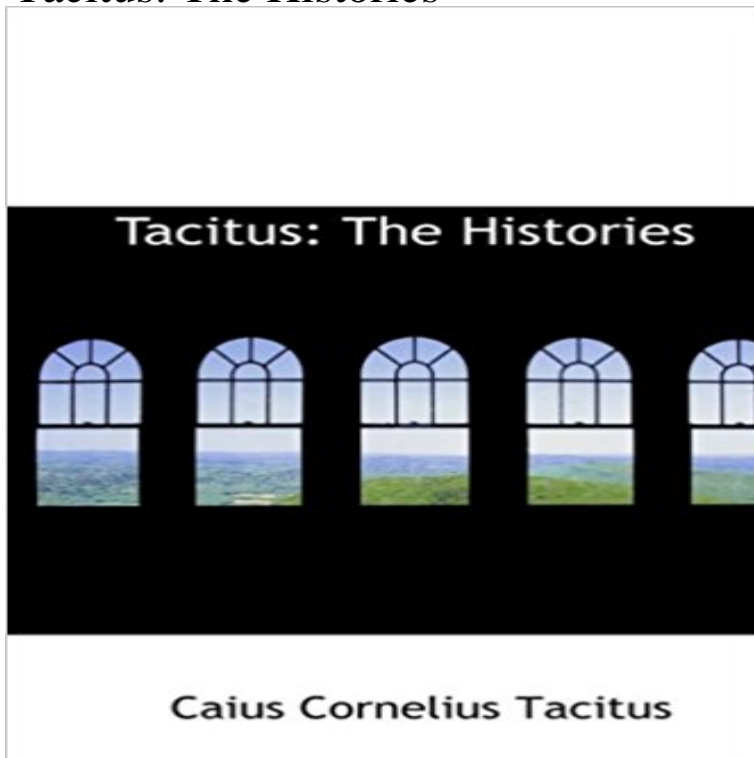


Tacitus: The Histories
